



Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics

The ALSO Provider Course:

ALSO is a structured, evidence-based, multidisciplinary training program on the practical management of obstetric emergencies. The two-day course is for maternity care providers including physicians, midwives, nurses and other clinicians.

Course Objective:

At the end of the course all participants should be able to describe, discuss, and manage treatment options for the following conditions:

- **First Trimester Complications**
- **Late Pregnancy Bleeding**
- **Preterm Labor/PROM**
- **Labor Dystocia**
- **Safety in Maternity Care**
- **Medical Complications**
- **Maternal Resuscitation**
- **Postpartum Hemorrhage**
- **Intrapartum Fetal Surveillance**
- **Shoulder Dystocia**
- **Assisted Delivery**
- **Malpresentations**
- **Intrapartum Ultrasound**

Accreditation:

This activity has been reviewed and is acceptable for up to 25.75 (Prescribed or Elective) credits by the American Academy of Family Physicians. 10.25 of these credits conform to the AAFP criteria for evidence-based CME clinical content. Course Purpose:

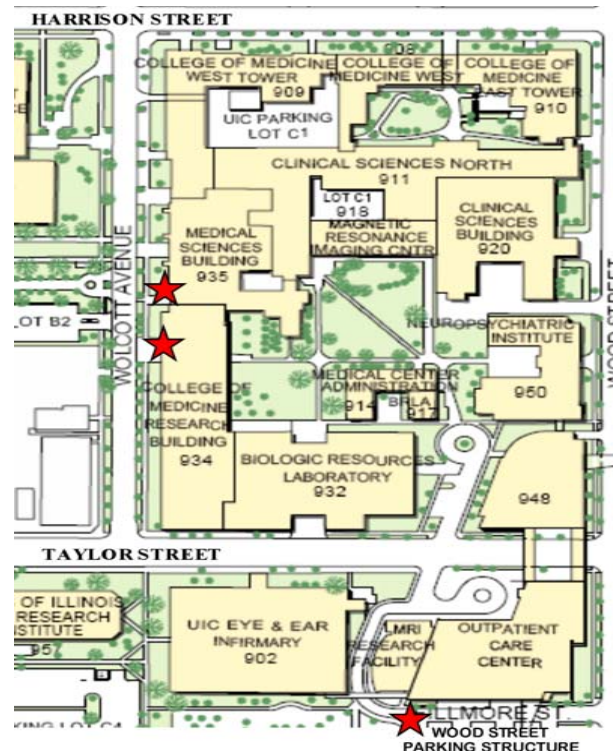
- ◆ To increase cognitive knowledge regarding the diagnosis and management of obstetrical emergencies

Driving Instructions:

From the North: Take the Kennedy Expressway to the Eisenhower Expressway westbound and keep to the right; take the second exit from the Eisenhower Expressway, which is Ashland Avenue south to Taylor Street; then go west on Taylor Street to the campus.

From the West: Take the Eisenhower Expressway to the Ashland Avenue exit; take Ashland south to Taylor Street; then go west on Taylor to the campus.

From the East: Take Harrison Street or Roosevelt Road west to Wood Street. If you take Harrison, go south on Wood Street to campus, or from Roosevelt Road go north on Wood to the campus.

From the South: Take the Dan Ryan Expressway and exit on Roosevelt Road (1200 south); go west on Roosevelt to Wood Street; then go north on Wood to the campus.
