



Resident Research Webinar

Thursday, May 24, 2012 – Presentations all day long!

Save the date now, and start planning your project!

Illinois Family Medicine Residency Programs can select up to two resident research projects to compete in a statewide Resident Research Forum – no travel required! IAFP first piloted the resident research webinar in May 2011. We found a system that works and have made changes/improvements based on feedback from residents, reviewers and family medicine faculty.

Some simple guidelines and examples from last year

- Research may be completed or in-progress
- Presentations are limited to a maximum of 25 slides (can be less than 25).
- View some great presentations from the 2011 IAFP Resident Research Webinar on the IAFP web site at www.iafp.com/residents to give you an idea what to expect.
- Programs that participate should provide at least one faculty reviewer to commit to one 90 minute review session during the webinar on May 24. Residents who are not competing in the webinar may also volunteer to serve as a peer reviewer. A short “reviewer training conference call” will be held the week of May 21st before the webinar.
- **By May 1** – residency programs select 1 or 2 presentations. Programs should email the resident’s name and research presentation title to gflynn@iafp.com.

Live Presentations on May 24

Presenting residents will login to the webinar and present live to a panel of anonymous reviewers as well as any resident or faculty that choose to login and observe. *If you miss your scheduled start time, there will not be another opportunity to present.*

- Presenters will sign up in advance for a slot in their preferred 90-minute block of time that fits his/her schedule and submit slides in advance. IAFP staff will confirm your exact 15 minute window in that time block the week of May 14th.
- Your presentation slides will be pre-loaded into the webinar system for you.
- A Moderator introduces the researcher and passes the “ball” to resident to start presentation. Presenters advance their own slides from their computers.
- Residents have **10 minutes** to deliver their entire presentation. There is a 2 minute warning to help presenters in ending on time.
- After the presentation, a 3-minute question and answer session follow.
- Presenters are scored on the **quality of their research design, the quality of their slides, their verbal presentation and their responses to questions.**
- Scores will be shared back to resident presenters by June 3 and a final ranking will be released privately to all resident presenters and volunteer reviewers.
