# Illinois Resolution

## Resolution 406 - Development of National Bureau for Gun Safety ACTION TAKEN BY THE 2021 CONGRESS OF DELEGATES: REFERRED TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

### Referred to the Reference Committee on Health of the Public and Science

- WHEREAS, Despite persistent efforts to reduce firearm injury and death over the past twenty years, deaths from firearm injuries have increased by over 20%, and
- WHEREAS, compared to other wealthy countries, the rate of gun deaths per capita in the United States is over 25 times higher, and
- WHEREAS, it is necessary to define firearm injury and death as a public health crisis, and use methods for reduction that have been proven effective, and
- WHEREAS, health professionals have actively participated in the effort to reduce firearm injury by speaking out against "gag laws", restrictions on firearm injury research funding, and
- WHEREAS, there have been comprehensive, multidimensional strategies suggested, that provide an extensive list of proposals designed to reduce firearm injury and death, and
- WHEREAS, doctors can be encouraged to address firearm injury and death with the same tools used successfully to confront other public health concerns for decades, and
- WHEREAS, the National Highway Safety Bureau (NHSB) addressed the problem of motor vehicle death by
  systematically using a public health approach, promoting and implementing safety technology, supporting
  research into causes and contributing factors and fostering public awareness of seat belt use, and
- WHEREAS, the NHSB coordinated its activities to complement each other, acting synergistically to reduce injuries resulting in a motor vehicle death rate which has fallen by two-thirds, and

### Referred to the Reference Committee on Health of the Public and Science

- WHEREAS, the life-saving potential of seatbelts was realized due to the synergistic use legislation that added laws and financial penalties for disobedience, and the media who increase public awareness of the importance of seat belt wearing, and
- WHEREAS, a "call to action" from eight health organizations and the American Bar Association advocates for a series of measures aimed at reducing the health and public health consequences of firearms, and
- WHEREAS, the American Academy of Family Physicians has also identified the prevention of gun violence as a public health issue, and
- WHEREAS, significantly improved reduction in firearm injury can be achieved with the coordinated use of the modalities as was used to increase seatbelt use, and
- WHEREAS, the synergistic coordination of multiple modalities is best accomplished through a single entity such as the NHSB, and
- WHEREAS, coordination at the federal level is essential to provide a unified, coherent response, and
- WHEREAS, approaching this issue as a safety issue, and a health issue, opens up the possibility of firearm owners and health professionals working together on many areas of consensus, and
- WHEREAS, to be maximally effective at decreasing firearm injury and deaths in the U.S. a National Bureau for Gun Safety must be created, now, therefore, be it

Referred to the Reference Committee on Health of the Public and Science

- RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians support the creation of a National Bureau for Gun Safety, to be run by experts in public health, medicine, engineering, communications and law enforcement working together in a transparent and nonpartisan organization, and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians support the National Bureau for Gun Safety in developing a research agenda


