# Description of the legislative initiative

Amends the Good Samaritan Act to provide liability protection for Volunteer Medical Reserve Corps members assisting certified local health departments during emergencies that are not declared disasters.

The Volunteer Medical Reserve Corps was established under federal law to ensure an adequate supply of licensed, credentialed trained healthcare volunteers in case of a federal, state, local or tribal public health emergency.

## Practical example of what this would accomplish

All Illinois residents are protected by certified local health departments that respond to outbreaks of infectious disease in the community. Large numbers of people may be affected and need care, such as vaccinations, as occurred during the 2009 H1N1 influenza outbreak.

Local Volunteer Medical Reserve Corps members are nurses, dentists, doctors, and pharmacists licensed and credentialed in Illinois. By joining the Volunteer Medical Reserve Corps these individuals also receive training in Incident Command and Emergency Preparedness.

Currently these healthcare professionals would have no liability protection while volunteering to assist a certified local health department to control the spread of infectious disease.

### Financial impact of the concern without legislative action

If liability coverage is not clearly provided for credentialed personnel serving in a Volunteer Medical Reserve Corps, local governments will find it difficult to recruit critical qualified assistance.

#### Legal opinion

This proposed legislative liability protection for Medical Reserve Corps volunteers would be similar to liability protection for a public paramedic on a call available through the Emergency Medical Services Act. The proposed legislation is an important step towards ensuring that trained professionals are able to assist their communities.
